The use of creative stimuli is used regularly to provoke discussions around vocabulary, spark imaginations and enhance engagement. CURRICULUM AIMS

Our three priorities for the teaching of Writing are:

1. To give children the opportunities and motivate them to record their ideas fluently from mark making and letter formation to sentence and paragraph creation.
2. Provide children with a stimulating writing environment surrounded by print in a variety of forms and contexts from a range of different cultures.
3. Teach a full range of writing strategies, including spelling, grammar, sentence structure and composition. Model the process of editing and improving to develop a piece of work.
