Prayer Names and Times

We pray five times a day. The time of each prayer depends on the sun, which means that we pray at different times daily.

1. **Fajr:** before sunrise.

2. **Dhuhr:** at midday.



3. **Asr:** in the late afternoon.

4. **Maghrib:** after sunset.

5. **Isha:** at night time.



The Meaning of Prayer

Understand your actions in prayer to truly connect with God and find strength in prayer

Wudu

A symbolic gesture of spiritually cleansing yourself

Clothing

You cover your body to display your humility and modesty

Prayer Times

Removing ego and disciplining yourself to pray on time

Standing

Keep hands folded out of respect and humility

Raising Hands

Clearing your mind of thoughts, images and worries

Facing Ka'bah

Reminding yourself that you are a true follower of Abraham

Prostration

Reminder that God's guidance comes before all desires

Bowing

Humbling your body before God

Concluding

Close the prayer with a call for peace and mercy
